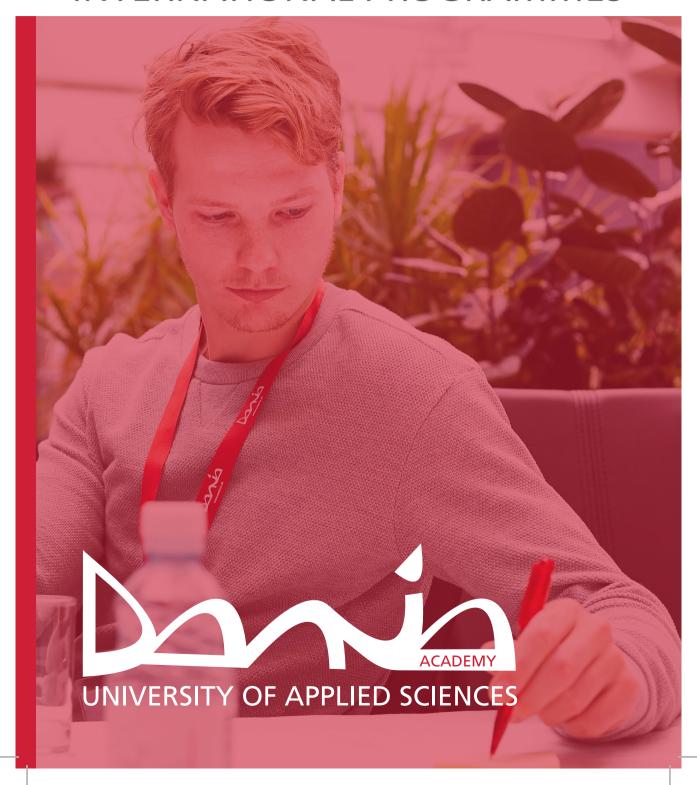

In international terms, Dania is a university of applied sciences. Dania provides a variety of study programmes in 8 different Danish cities.

Around 2500 students attend our programmes. We have more than 300 international students.

International Programmes

At the moment we are offering five different programmes in

English. These international programmes are based in two cities - *Viborg* and *Randers*.

International Campus Randers

The campus in Randers is the largest of Dania's many campuses, offering six different programmes. Three of these are International Programmes. The academy is situated on the outskirts of the city surrounded

by nature and only three minutes away from the largest shopping centre in Randers.

International Campus Viborg

The Viborg campus lies in the city centre. In Viborg we offer four different programmes of which three are taught in English. It is a brand new campus hosting a number of educational institutions.

Denmark is highly dependent on brain power since we do not have many natural resources. This is why the educational system focuses hard on developing human resources.

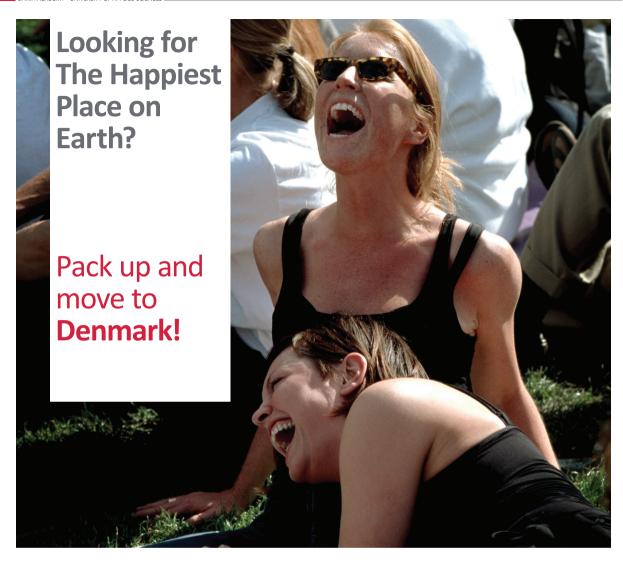
Denmark is known for its high standard of living and for a well-developed welfare system.

Denmark, the Happiest Place on Earth

Denmark has taken the top spot in the World Happiness Report.

According to the World Happiness Report published by The Earth Institute at Columbia University and commissioned for a United Nations conference on happiness, Denmark is the happiest country in the world.

The 158-page report, the first of its kind ever, ranks countries on a "life evaluation score" that takes into account a variety of factors such as wealth,

education, government transparency, political freedom and job security.

"It is no coincidence that the happiest countries in the world tend to be high-income countries that also have a high degree of social equality, trust and quality of government", write the authors of the study in the introduction.

Randers, with some 62,000 inhabitants, is situated on the Randers Fjord near the mouth of the river Gudenåen on the east coast of Jutland just 35 km north of Denmark's second largest city, Aarhus.

Campus Randers offers a total of 6 different programmes with around 200 international students from all around the world. 3 programmes are taught in English.

Randers – City and Countryside Randers is a modern thriving city with many stores, malls, tourist attractions, lots of different sports clubs and many cultural activities.

The main tourist attraction of Randers is *The Rain Forest*, a beautiful representation of the World's rain forests inside three domed glass buildings situated on the banks of the river *Gudenåen*. Tourists come from many countries to see the animals and plants indigenous to the world's rain forests.

Randers' medieval town centre is a picturesque pedestrian area.

The Randers Festival that takes place every year in early August is a week filled with fun and entertainment featuring all kinds of live music.

Værket is the place to go for concerts, theatre plays, opera and much more. Værket is based in the old city power station that has been transformed into a centre for the performing arts.

An ideal way of touring the town and the surrounding countryside is by bicycle, and if you like canoeing several outlets rent out canoes for excursions.

Moreover, the river Gudenåen and Randers Fjord offer great game fishing for salmon and



trout.

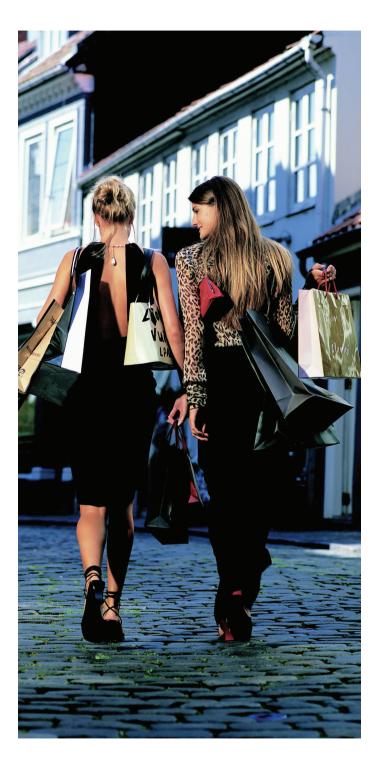

AP Degree Programmes

An Academy Profession (AP) Degree Programme is a higher-education programme with a duration of two years that combines theoretical studies with a practice-oriented approach. The AP Degree represents the first 4 semesters of a Bachelor's Degree.

AP Degree Programmes are offered at Academies of Professional Higher Education in Denmark.

The Academies have fewer students than universities since they offer a limited number of study programmes, facilitating close contact between students and companies in the region.

The AP Degree Programmes make use of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS), a common European standard, where 60 Credits correspond to one year of full-time studies at higher-education level.

Career Prospects

The AP Degree Programmes are designed in close collaboration with representatives from relevant industries to ensure that the graduates get the qualifications and skills needed by the industry. The educations include guest lecturers from private businesses, field visits and a 3 months' internship in a Danish or foreign company.

The close contact with businesses gives the students an excellent starting point for finding a job after graduation.

The internship also gives the students an opportunity to use the acquired theory in practice.

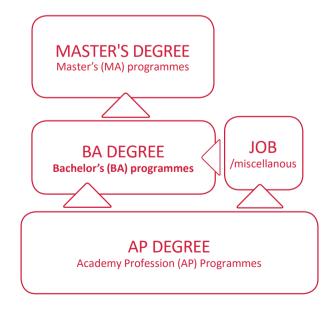
BA top-up Programmes

Marketing Management

Are you planning a career in marketing and sales? Would you like to experience real-world business life? Do you want a truly international education? Then the Marketing Management Programme is the perfect education for you.

Programme Objective

The purpose of the programme is to qualify graduates for independent work on analysis, planning and implementation of marketing tasks using cultural, organizational, financial, technological and marketing skills obtained during the studies.

Degree Obtained

AP Degree in Marketing Management

Duration and ECTS-Credits

The AP Degree in Marketing Management is a twoyear, full-time programme that corresponds to 120 ECTS-credits. An AP Degree represents the first two years of a Bachelor's Degree. In order to obtain a full BA Degree, AP graduates must enroll and complete a Top-up study programme in Denmark or abroad.

Teaching Methods

The applied teaching methods aim at developing students' independent, innovative and cooperative skills. The classes are small (typically between 20 and 30 students) and students are encouraged to contribute actively to classroom discussions. Project and group work are essential parts of the studies.

Attendance to lectures is compulsory.

During the programme, a number of tests and exams must be passed in order to move on to the next semester.

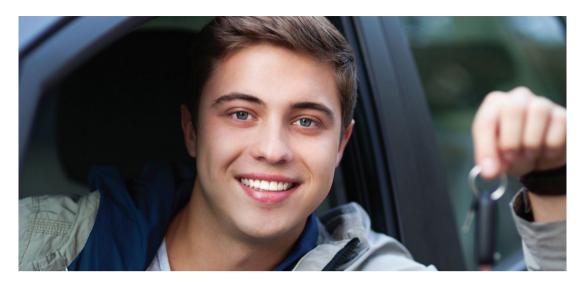

Automotive Management

The first three semesters of the two-year programme are taught at Dania in Viborg.

During the last semester there is a 3-months' internship period and time for the students to write their final examination project.

Programme Objective

The programme qualifies the graduates to work independently on diagnostics, repair and optimization of automotive technology. It also qualifies the graduates to take on the overall management of a garage, as well as administration and training of staff.

Teaching and Working Methods

The teaching methods are a combination of group instruction, project work in groups and individual work, typically involving interdisciplinary issues and always on an application-oriented basis.

Compulsory Subjects:

- Component Technology and Design
- Electronic Principles and Systems
- Driving Systems and Vehicle Dynamics
- IT Diagnostic Systems
- Sales, Service and Customer
- Operational and Financial Management
- HR Management
- Organisation, Communication and Project Management.

Elective Subjects:

Varying optional elements are offered during the first three semesters. Elective subjects could for instance be:

- Hybrid / Electric Cars
- Data Logging and Analysis
- Optimisation of Bodywork
- LEAN Optimisation
- Entrepreneurship

Specialisation

The specialisation is based on the students' choice of optional elements and location for the internship.

Internship

The students will complete their practical training in one or more companies.

Dania offers a number of internships in Denmark, in Europe, the USA and other countries.

Final Examination Project

In the final examination project each student must demonstrate his or her ability to combine theory and practice. Supervisors from the automotive business will be available to the students for this project.

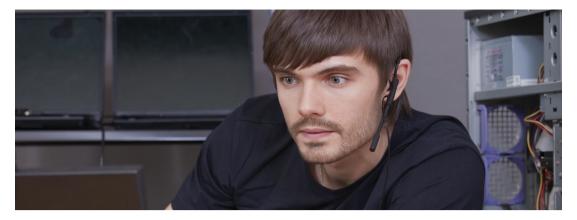

The Broad Field of IT Technology

IT Technology is more than bits and bytes.

Involving users in IT, management and planning requires skills in sales, innovation, communication and marketing.

Career Options

The IT Technology programme prepares you for two roles: the consultant and the technician.

The IT Technology programme includes business and technology as well as general studies to give you a solid base for a number of job positions such as Project Manager, Consultant or Network Technician.

The Programme

The two-year programme is divided into four semesters. The first three semesters are taught at Dania Viborg and during the last semester there is a 3 months' internship and time to write your final examination project.

Compulsory Subjects

- General studies, including Communications, Technical Documentation, Technical Mathematics, Information Technology and Electronics
- · Business Studies, including

Business Purchasing and Sales, Business Economics, Business Organisation, Project Management, Environment and Security, and Quality

 Technology, which includes the base electives within either Electronics or Communications Technology.

Specialisations

- Networks

Networks

We look at everything from signal propagation at the physical level to application protocols such as HTTP.

We concentrate on IP networks and supporting concepts, but also look at other types of industrial networks, such CanBus for automotive control and the maritime Automatic Identification System (AIS).

Network Practical

This area concentrates on setup, operation and troubleshooting of IP based networks.

Server

Setup, operation and troubleshooting of Microsoft Server products (including SQL Server) is the main focus, but we also cover aspects of Linux Server (Ubuntu) setup and use.

Programming

Work with network-related programming concepts (web services, app programming, server side applications, client side JavaScript, etc.) using ASP. NET, PHP/MySQL, Android and/or Apple iOS (iPhone/iPad), depending on the students' particular interests and previous experience.

Electronics

Embeded systems

This subject focuses mainly on design, construction, programming and testing in the area of embedded systems.

Electronics

This subject will develop the students' skills in the areas of electronic technology, the design process of electronic systems, production technology and management of electronic devices and in the use of relevant CAE and simulation tools.

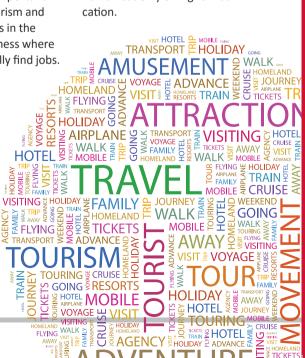

Student Finances

Student jobs

Many international students at Dania choose to find a part-time job to finance their student life in Denmark. This is fine as long as the job does not interfere with the students' attendance at the full-time study programme.

If you are looking for a part-time job, Dania's international office can assist you with information on working permit and taxation.

School-Related Expenses

All students will have to purchase textbooks and other educational material and pay for field trips etc.

The expenses for text books for a two-year study will amount to approximately 600 €. In addition to school-related expenses, you will need to consider your living expenses, which will depend on your spending habits and lifestyles.

A general estimation of the living costs including local transportation, accommodation, food and other personal expenses is 700 € per month. However, according to several of our international students, they can get by for less than that.

Accommodation

Most of our international students choose to live in the student dormitories.

Should you prefer to live in a privately rented accommodation, the rent will typically be higher. You should expect to pay at least 3-400 € for a 2-room apartment (excluding electricity, water, heating and internet) plus a deposit corresponding to 3 months' rent



Language Courses

Both in Viborg and Randers, the city offers FREE Danish language courses for foreigners living there.

Tuition Fee

There are no tuition fees for EU/EEA and Nordic Students. Students from non-EU countries normally pay tuition fees. We charge a small administration fee for all students.

The Danish Educational System



Academy Profession (AP) Programmes

The programmes normally last two years (120 ECTS credits). They combine theory and practice in one programme.

The programmes are developed in close cooperation with businesses and the industry.

All AP programmes feature a compulsory internship. AP programmes are also characterised by having small-size classes and close contact between students and lecturers.

Professional Bachelor's Programmes

The Professional Bachelor's (BA) programmes combine theoretical study with practical application. Internships are always included in the programmes.

The length is from $1\frac{1}{2}$ - $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. (90 ETCS-credits for $1\frac{1}{2}$ year Top-up programmes - 210 ECTS-credits for $3\frac{1}{2}$ year BA Programmes).

Master's Programmes

The Master's programme is research-based and gives students theoretical knowledge combined with the ability to apply this practically. Master's programmes normally last 2 years. (120 ETCS-credits)

Top-up Studies

Top-up Studies

Dania University of Applied Sciences has agreements with a number of Danish and foreign universities about accepting graduates from Dania's programmes for top-up degrees.

Students will be accepted at these universities based on an individual assessment of qualifications.

Additionally, our students may apply for a top-up degree at any university of their choice, presenting their Diploma and the study curriculum. The university will then evaluate the student's results and the contents of the education completed at Dania.

Universities decide if they will admit AP students. High grades are required to be admitted at some universities.

Accommodation in Randers

Most of our international students in Randers choose to live at the student dormitory *Randers Kollegiegård*.

Other students prefer to live in the modern *youth apartments* right on the campus area in Randers.

And finally some students rent a room or a flat from a private house owner.

The dormitory is situated 8 km from Dania. From the dormitory there are several bus lines going downtown and direct bus connections to the Academy.

The dormitory rooms are furnished, but you must bring

your own linen, sheets and covers or a sleeping bag. Also, you have to supply your own cutlery and china as well as cookware. Prices range from 1,530 - 2500 DKK per month.

The youth apartments are rented unfurnished and prices range from 3,200 - 3,400 DKK per month.

The deposit is at least 3 month's rent.



Accommodation in Viborg

The city government in Viborg guarantees accommodation for all incoming students.

The majority will get a room at the new modern dorms next door to the campus area.

Prices range from 1,930-4,230 DKK per month.

Sharing an apartment is also an option, with the cost per person starting at around 1,200 DKK per month.

The dormitory is situated 200 m from Dania.

Admission

All applicants must have an upper-secondary education, 12 years of High School or equivalent. Sufficient English skills must be proven by an official language test.

Other appropriate educational backgrounds may be approved by Dania. Please contact the International Department for further information.

We conduct interviews with all our applicants prior to final admission. This is necessary to ensure the right match of programme and applicant and to ensure that the applicant has an appropriate level of English.
